DAVID & KAREN REESE: David wanted to bring to the Boards attention the property the State transferred back to the Village is having some problems with sink holes, he has been filling them but there is more after all the rain we have had. David stated it is across from the lift station where they have the black top and it is happening after the black top. Wanted to know if this is his problem or the Villages? He also stated it is not safe to cut the grass back there any more because of all the holes. Matt stated he should meet with Dale and Ross and check everything out and we will see what needs to be done.

DICKEYVILLE-PARIS FIRE DEPARTMENT: Chief Trost came to the board to let them know how the fire department is doing. Things are very tight with their budget right now. They are in the same position they were last year currently. Their budget meeting is set for Tuesday October 16, 2018, the board will receive a letter with date and time They are hoping to receive and increase in the budget, so they are not in this same position next year.

BUILDING PERMITS: Ric has a couple new houses he will be doing inspections on. There were some concerns about a chicken coop. The Village of Dickeyville does allow for chickens in the Village if the ordinance is followed. Ric will talk to the owner and issue him a building permit for this. He will also talk with the owner of the property to make sure it is okay with them that they have the chicken coop. Ric talked with Daryl Hinderman about his deteriorating building and he told Ric that he will have it tore down and a new one up by September 2019.

Event Barn project is going well. Ric has been in contact with Charlie Wamsley and they are waiting for the engineer Travis to write off on his part, but they do have a verbal permission to use the Event Barn for events till October 15, 2018. Ric and Travis agreed that the deck will need bracing and Charlie said that will be done.

- 1. Dickeyville Police Dept was reimbursed \$3439.00 for the Grant that purchased a new Police Care Computer and printer.
- 2. Chief Reuter participated with a school active shooter training on August 29th at the Lancaster High School, along with multiple other agencies. It was a very interesting scenario and a realistic approach and response to a reported school emergency.
- 3. September 11-14 Chief Reuter will be attending a Zuercher Computer Program New user/Learner training in Sioux Falls, SD Conference training and meals are free, Village pays the hotel.
- 4. Deputy Matt Small advised me he approached the Village of Potosi and Tennyson reference starting a municipal court. Deputy Small stated the villages of Potosi and Tennyson would like information/presentation of the process and the benefits of a municipal court for their board meeting on October 1, 2018. I contacted our village Attorney, Paul Johnson. Paul is favorable of the municipal court idea and is very familiar with the process. Paul advised me he has an ordinance and combined municipal contract ordinance he will provide prior to October 1 for Potosi and Tennyson to review. The municipal court will operate with much less cost if several communities combine and split the cost of the judge and clerk. The village still retains its own violation deposits court. I will have further information and documents to review for the October Village Board Meeting.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT:

- 1. Purple Dump Truck The truck is shot. We took it to Guys for evaluation and he told me several items were putting the truck at a point beyond repair. A. The engine is basically shot. B. the transmission is in-need-of-repair. C. the brake lines won't make the winter, D. the exhaust is shot. He may have mentioned other things but that is what comes to mind. He said the repairs needed would be in the \$20,000 range. I got prices on a Ford 550 and 450 from Pioneer Ford in Platteville. I also got in touch with Chris Kerkel, of Runde Chevrolet, but they do not have anything currently in stock, but they could order one. We spoke to Chad Eggers, of Potosi, and they recently purchased a F550 and are very happy with it. I spoke with Grant County Truck Bodies about being able to transfer the box from the old unit to the new truck and it can be done. Tim Boldt, of Pioneer Ford, told me that if we ordered a truck now it would get in about Xmas. Then we would have to have it outfitted with the old box and hydraulics if that is what you choose to do. The truck is priced with a snow plow package.
- 2. Domi Avenue KD Engineering thought since we are delaying our water main and overlay project to next spring that we move the curb & gutter in a foot toward the street so separate the sidewalk and curb. Should we be getting bids on this project now for next spring, so we can get good prices? Sidewalks would be special assess to owners.
- 3. Trees Ross and I cut down two trees at Comm Park. We plan to do at least one more. The trees at Kuepers Park and the Comm Center are dying and plans for removal and replacement should at least be in the planning stages.
- 4. Vacations Both Ross and I have scheduled vacations coming up.
- 5. S-Side Lift Station This project should be closed out.
- 6. Ross and Tom George went to a meeting at University of Platteville and talked with some of the engineers about a splash pad for Community Park. They will do some designing for free. This is all in the planning stage right now. After they have the design done they will come and present it to the Village Board. Village Board stated we should have a Park meeting so everyone knows what will are thinking about.
