FINAL RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING IMPROVEMENTS AND LEVY OF SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS UNDER SECTION 66.0703 WISCONSIN STATUTES AGAINST BENEFITED PROPERTY

The Village Board of the Village of Dickeyville having held a Public Hearing at the Village of Dickeyville Community Building in Room A, 500 East Avenue, Dickeyville, WI 53808 at 6:00 p.m. on February 13th, 2019 for the purpose of hearing all interested persons concerning the preliminary resolution and report of the Village Engineer on the proposed improvements at the location as follows:

a. On Domi Avenue from North Church Street to Orchard Avenue.

After due notice thereof having been given as required by law, and all parties desiring to be heard having been heard, and the report of the Village Engineer having been considered;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED by the Village Board of the Village of Dickeyville as follows:

- That the report of the Village Engineer pertaining to the construction of the above described public improvements, including plans and specifications therefore, as same, may have been modified is hereby adopted and approved.
- 2. That the improvements be carried out in accordance with the report as approved.
- 3. That payment for said improvements be made by assessing the cost to the property benefited as indicated in said report and that the benefits and damages shown on the report, subject only to modifications if any made thereon, are true and correct, and are hereby confirmed.
- 4. The property owner may at their option pay the assessment in cash or in four installments. That the first installation on each said special assessments shall be due on the 1st day of November and in the case where they whole sum must be paid in a lump sum and not in installments, said sum shall likewise be due on said date. If installments are paid when due such installment amounts are to bear interest at the rate of 5% per year for the first four years. Installments not paid when due shall bear additional interest on the amount due at the rate of 2% per annum and in case any such assessments or installments are not paid by the date specified same shall extend upon the tax roll as a delinquent tax against the property, and all proceedings in relation to the collection return and sale of property for delinquent real estate taxes shall apply to same except as may otherwise be provided by Statute.
- 5. That the funds needed to make said improvements shall be taken out of the Special Assessment Fund set up by said Village as a revolving fund for said purpose, and that at such time as payment is made on the special assessment herein provided, said sums so paid shall be returned to said Special Assessment Fund.
- 6. That the Village Clerk is directed to publish this resolution in the official newspaper of the Village and to mail a copy hereof to every property owner whose name appears on the assessment roll whose post office address is known or can with reasonable diligence by ascertained.

EVENT BARN: Plan Commission made a recommendation to the Village Board to except the Conditional Use Permit for the Event Barn at 350 South Main Street, Dickeyville, WI, with changes they made at their meeting.

CONDITIONAL USE PERMIT

RE: Real property located within the Village of Dickeyville, Grant County, Wisconsin, more particularly described as Tax Parcel No. 116-00046-0000, with an address of 350 Main Street, Dickeyville, Wisconsin (hereinafter "the Property").

This Conditional Use Permit is granted this 22nd day of January 2019, by the Village of Dickeyville Plan Commission (hereinafter "Commission") to Rock Cut Development Inc. (hereinafter "Grantee") for the operation of an Event Barn on that part of the Property that contains the Event Barn and the immediately surrounding area of the Event Barn.

WHEREAS, on January 22, 2019 a meeting was held of the Village of Dickeyville Plan Commission to hear and consider Grantee's application for a Conditional Use Permit (hereinafter "the CUP"), pursuant to Article IV of Chapter 285 of the Village of Dickeyville Code of Ordinances (hereinafter "the Code") for the operation of an Event Barn on the Property; and

WHEREAS, the Property is located in the I-P Industrial Zoning District; and

WHEREAS, the Commission has determined that, based on the report of the Village Building Inspector, and with the imposition of certain conditions, the Commission finds granting the CUP is in accordance with the purpose and intent of Chapter 285 of the Code and is found to not be hazardous, harmful, offensive or otherwise adverse to the environment or the value of the neighborhood or the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Commission hereby approves the issuance of a CUP to the Grantee for the operation of an Event Barn on the Property subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. Pursuant to the March 26, 2018 CUP, Grantee was to complete various repairs and improvements to the Event Barn as part of being granted a CUP. The Village Building Inspector has certified that the following improvements have been made and Grantee shall remain in compliance with the following requirements for the duration of this Conditional Use Permit:
 - a. Front entrance doors must swing outward.
 - b. The exterior grade at the front entrance must match the threshold to the entrance of the front doorway.
 - c. Rear door must be ADA compliant.
 - d. The parking lot must have handicapped parking spaces and signage as required by ADA requirements.
 - e. Emergency/exit lighting shall be installed and operational for all exits.
 - f. Fire extinguishers shall be installed pursuant to state fire code.

- g. The front entrance must be ADA compliant by providing a 60" x 60" 2% or less grade platform in front of the doorway.
- h. The back-entrance ramp must be ADA compliant by providing a 60" x 60" 2% or less grade platform at the top and bottom of the ramp. The maximum ramp slope shall be no more than 1:12. A hand rail is required along with spindles/guards.
- i. Restrooms must be ventilated in accordance with commercial building code requirements and all restrooms must be made ADA compliant.
- j. The new 4x4 wood post by the center of the existing beam to create two continuous spans must be maintained.
- k. Grantee shall maintain a \$1 million umbrella insurance policy naming the Village of Dickeyville as an additional insured. Grantee shall provide a copy of this policy to the Village Clerk upon request.
- 2. In addition to the conditions set forth in Section 1 above, the following conditions shall remain in place during the term of this CUP.
 - a. All handicap signage for parking lots shall be installed by May 1, 2019.
 - b. The maximum occupancy of the Event Barn shall be 300 occupants.
 - c. Until such time as adequate heating is installed in the Event Barn (up to commercial building code standards) the Event Barn may only be used between May 1 and October 15 each year.
 - d. There shall be no temporary heaters, space heaters or open flame allowed in the Event Barn.
 - e. Village Building Inspector and the Chief of the Dickeyville/Paris Fire Department may approve a one-day temporary use permit for the Event Barn outside of the May 1-October 15 time limitation on a day-to-day and case-by-case basis. If both Building Inspector and Fire Chief issue a one-day permit, a copy of that permit shall be filed with the Village Clerk at least 10 days prior to the event taking place.
 - f. Each November the Building Inspector and Fire Chief shall do an inspection of the Event Barn. If the Event Barn is not in compliance with the terms of this CUP, the Grantee shall be notified in writing of the violations and be given 90 days to cure the violations. If the violations are not cured within the 90-day period, either the Dickeyville Building Inspector or Dickeyville-Paris Fire Chief can suspend the CUP or temporarily restrict use of the Property until such time as the Plan Commission can meet to discuss and take further action.
 - 3. This Conditional Use Permit shall be in full force and effect until October 15, 2029.
