PUBLIC INPUT: Kayla Weber was at the board meeting to ask for a reduction in the sewer rate. They just bought the new home on Emil Street and they sowed seed for grass, and they are watering the lawn a lot. Ross and Dale said we really don't have a history on how much water they use. They would like to get a history and then we can credit them back for the sewer. Kayla suggested they could read the meter when they are watering and write it down. We will need a history and then we can credit their account back for the sewer.

Todd Lange was present for burning on his property in the Village. Dickeyville Police Department has received a complaint that he is burning more than wood at his house. He was addressed on this before if he would like to burn, he will need a burn permit. Ric has address this with Todd also and he said if he wanted the property out of the Village, he would have to file the correct paperwork to start things. Todd stated he will stop burning.

BUILDING PERMITS:

Ric talked to the Board back when we had our Employee evaluations and he has submitted his resignation for the Assessor for the Village of Dickeyville. He will do the Building Permits and the Zoning still.

We had an informal meeting for the Plan Commission on May 22 for the B's Subdivision. Keith Dalsing, Engineer, had some drawings on how the land could be laid out. This all depends on the Board and what they want to develop on the land. Ric stated the Chair for the Plan Commission should fill out the paperwork for the zoning permit. Chair for the Plan Commission is John Gantenbein. Once the application is filled out it will go to the Zoning inspector. Ric then will have 30 days to grant or deny the application. There are certain steps we need to take before everything is in place.

Ric issued 3 building permits, inspected 2 homes being built and did an inspection on a home on Rosalyn.

June 28th Dickeyville Police will again be participating in Stuff the Cruiser with groceries for the local food pantry at Kieler's Grocery and Liquor.

Had complaints on people dumping in the dumpsters at the parks. The dumpster at the park are for the park, they are not for public dumping. The Board would like Donna to call Republic and see if we can have locks on the dumpsters.

PUBLIC WORKS REPORT:

- 1. Domi Avenue The water main has been installed with some issues that have since been taken care of. 1st Supply sent the wrong Lugs and we had to replace the lugs. 1st Supply is paying for the extra time it took to do the replacing. The street needs to be cored out and shortly after that Augelli wants to come in to do the curb & gutter. Randy Budden has told Dale that he would rather have the fill from Domi Avenue on his property off-of Splinter Avenue and not Rita Avenue. Keith has some concerns with the concrete and large pieces of asphalt. He would rather it be more of a clean fill.
- 2. Chip Seal program is set with the following streets scheduled for chip seal. N. Main Street, N. Third Street, Ginter Street, Hillside Drive, Valley Lane and Sewer Plant Road. The Wastewater Treatment Plan parking lot may still be included in the mix. Scott Construction gave us a price of \$1.817/square yd using a granite chip. Dale went to Benton where they used the hot oil and granite chips and had no complaints for bleeding. Dale told Carl, from Scott's that we can try the hot oil instead of the emulsified oil. We have \$40,000.00 set aside in our account with Grant County. Dale also received a quote from Fahrner Asphalt. We are in the process of doing crack fill. We had East Avenue on budget, but we are not going to be doing that this year.
- 3. Pilot Study for Phosphorus begins this Thursday. MSA is supervising this and we will operate the plant according to their recommendations.
- 4. There is settling in from SC Data and Dale has some black dirt ordered from Wiederholt Excavating for this. There is a hole forming at Sunset. The ground is low.
- 5. Nick Schaal, our summer help started working May 20th and he has been doing a very good job.
- 6. Ross has an update on the solar funding. Ross told the board the Grant that they have been writing is due Friday June 14, 2019. All Ross needs is signatures. They only approve about 50% of the grants and we should hear by July 26th, 2019 if we are awarded the grant, then we have six months to start project.
- 7. Ross has an update on the skid steer this would take about 8 weeks when ordered. The cost would be \$28,900.00 with trade in of the tractor. Board is putting this on waiting list right now.
- 8. Special thanks to Tim Hilken and Glen Brandt for their help on projects in the Community Park, and the bleachers.

- Special thanks to Ron Errthum for his assistance in cutting down the trees in the Community Center. This saved the Village around a couple thousand dollars. Dale brought up, purchasing a gift certificate for Ron for all the work he has done.

Matt brought in a picture of new playground equipment for Kuepers Park. We are looking into options to improve the playground equipment. Ross suggested we investigate Grants and different Fund Raisers. We must take down the tall slid at the Community Park because it is not up to code. We are looking into equipment for the Community Park also.

Matt also stated that he has been approached to have the other field at the Community Park finish so tournaments can be played there next year. This is being looked into and more information will be available later.
